

About Task List

Task List is an application designed to help students track and manage their homework and assignments, and keep on top of numerous other aspects of their academic life. With a built-in note manager, grade recorder and goal list, it provides everything found in traditional assignment planners, with all the benefits of modern technology.

What's New in Task List 5.2

New Features

- Task List can now be secured with a password
- Added a School Overview for at-a-glance information
- Reference Information can now be customized
- Added option to only sync unchecked tasks with the widget
- Tasks exported to iCal now include any comments
- Added an option to not add an alarm when exporting tasks to iCal

Changes

- Averages, graphs, steps, etc. are now in a user-adjustable split view
- Tasks and notes can now be edited even if a class is selected in the source list
- The Dock is no longer badged if the task count is 0
- Comments are now saved automatically
- A notification is presented if you try to export a task or goal to iCal that has already been exported
- The priority slider now has 5 distinct levels
- A message has been added with the URL of a web page exported to an iDisk
- Removed legacy support for 4.x database
- The Notes source list is automatically updated when classes are added or removed
- Task List Lite now has sortable columns

Bugfixes

- The calendar view will now load current tasks when shown
- Fixed "theDataRow is not defined" error when changing classes
- Probably fixed the "no matching processes found" error on quit
- Numerous other minor tweaks and fixes

Installing

To install Task List or Task List Lite, just drag it into your Applications folder, or anywhere else you wish to keep it. To install the Task List Widget, open the Extras folder and double click it. To install the Task List QuickPick, use the installer.

Getting Started

If this is the first time you have used Task List, it will need some basic configuration before you can use it. First and foremost, you should configure your classes by choosing Task List > Preferences, and clicking the Classes icon. To add your classes, click the + button below the table. A sheet will appear attached to the Preferences window; only the name of your class is required, but it's a good idea to fill out the other information if you know it. When you're done, click the Add Class button on the sheet, and repeat the process for all of your classes. You may also want to take a few moments to configure the rest of the preferences. You can then add your assignments, goals, grades and notes to Task List, which will automatically save your changes when you quit.

Getting Help

Task List is designed to be easy to use, but if you need help, you're not out of luck. The built in help, accessible by choosing Help > Task List Help, should solve most basic problems.
